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Did you know? Snow Facts

Snowflakes aren't actually white, they are translucent. The sky's reflection is what gives it a white appearance.

What determines the shape of individual snowflakes is the air temperature around it.


Freshly fallen snow absorbs sound waves, giving a quieter ambience outside after a snow flurry.

Japanese macaques, also know as 'snow monkeys' have been observed making and playing with balls of snow. They love the snow!

Snow is a great insulator. because it is 90 to 95 percent trapped air. This is the reason many animals burrow deep into the snow during winter in order to hibernate. It's also the reason that igloos, can be 100 degrees warmer inside than outside.

Snowflakes can fall at a speed anywhere between 1 to 9 mph, depending on the environmental conditions in the air as they drop.








