

LEARNING COLORS

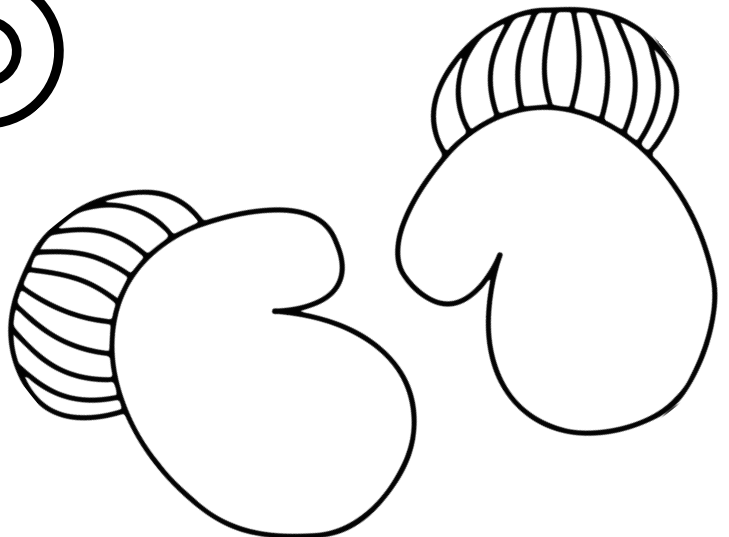
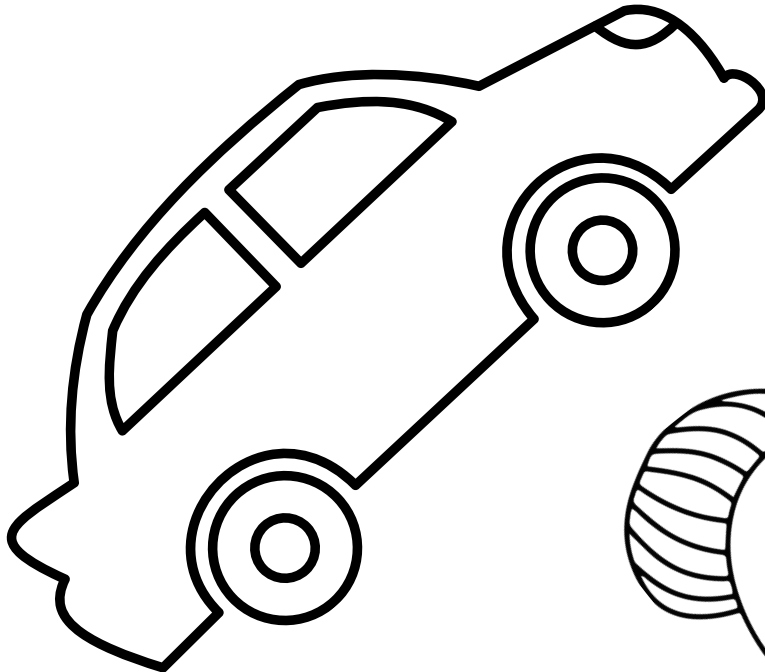
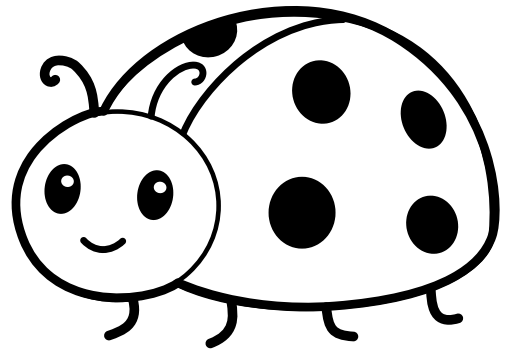
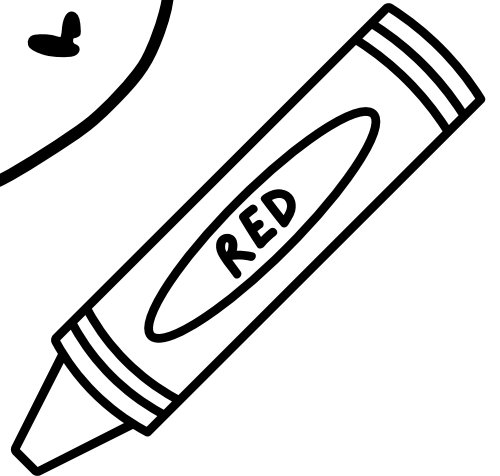
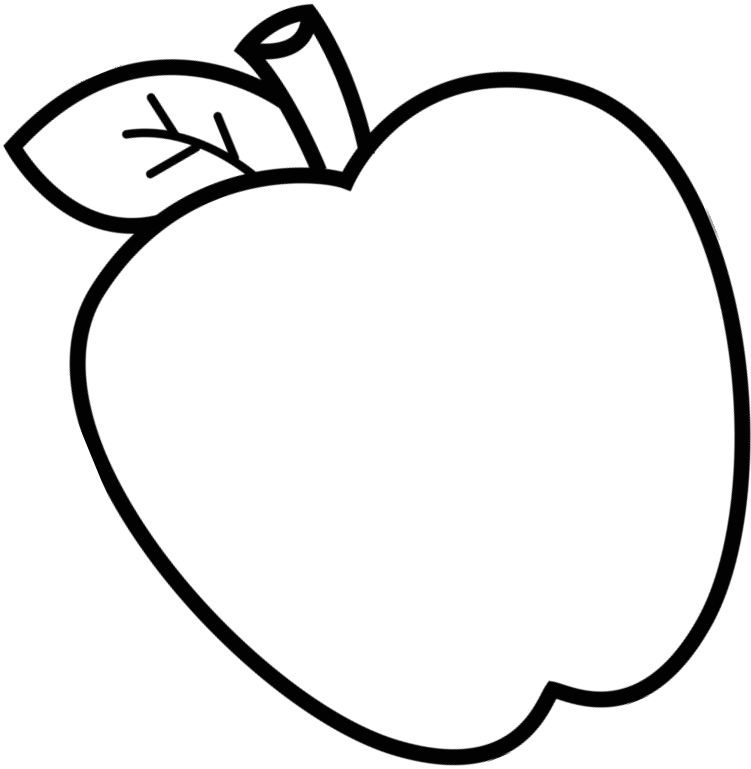
The key to this activity is allowing your child to explore colors in a structured manner. Giving them multiple items to fill in using the same color will allow them to focus on one color, but be motivated with different things. You do not have to limit them to using one coloring tool. For example, I made different watercolor shades of Red and even added glitter to one of the shades so my daughter felt like she was painting with different colors but they are all Red. This activity also helps keep my daughter from not mixing paints and markers, she loved it! You can do one page a day or spread them out however you like!

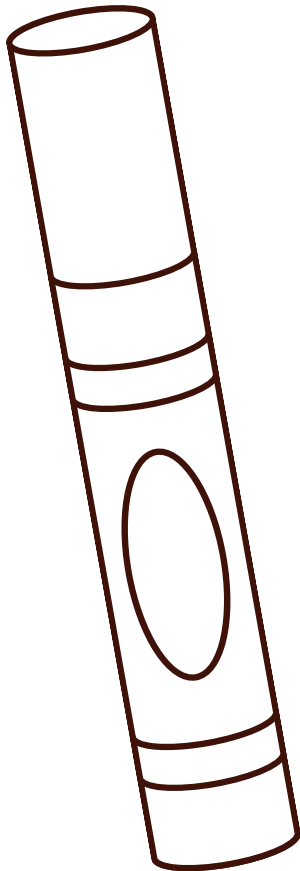
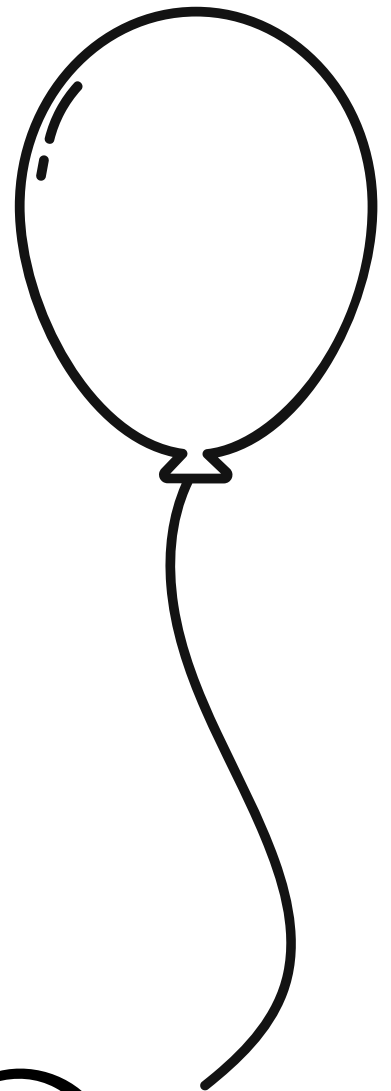
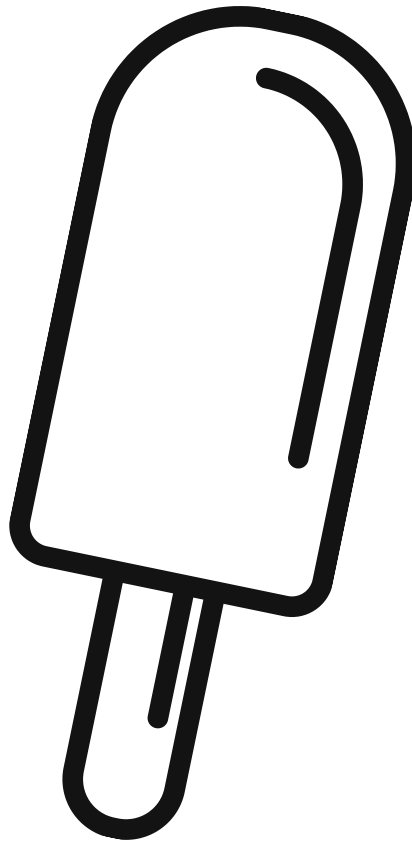
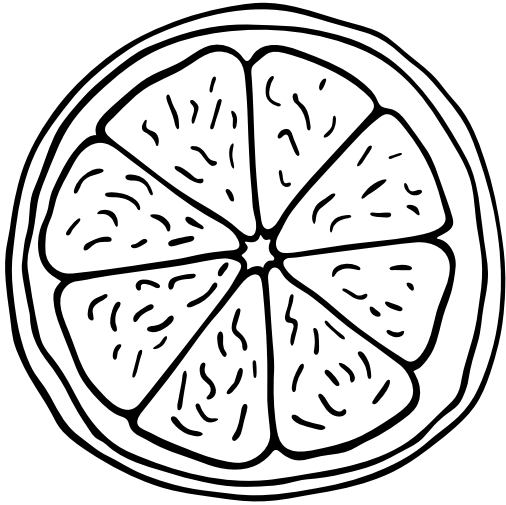
Pro Tip: Print on cardstock paper and cut out items to glue for a future project.

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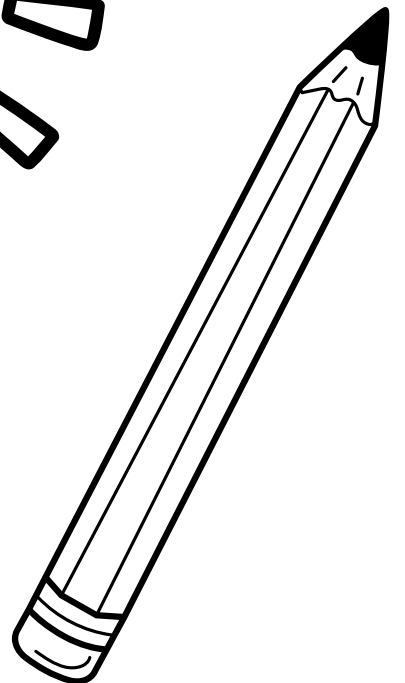
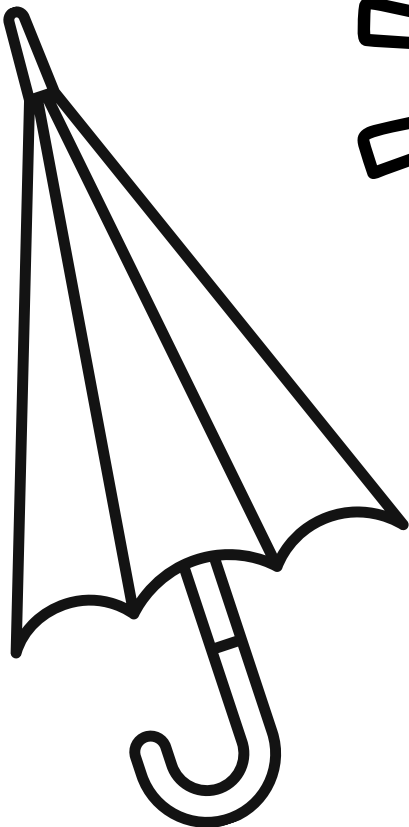
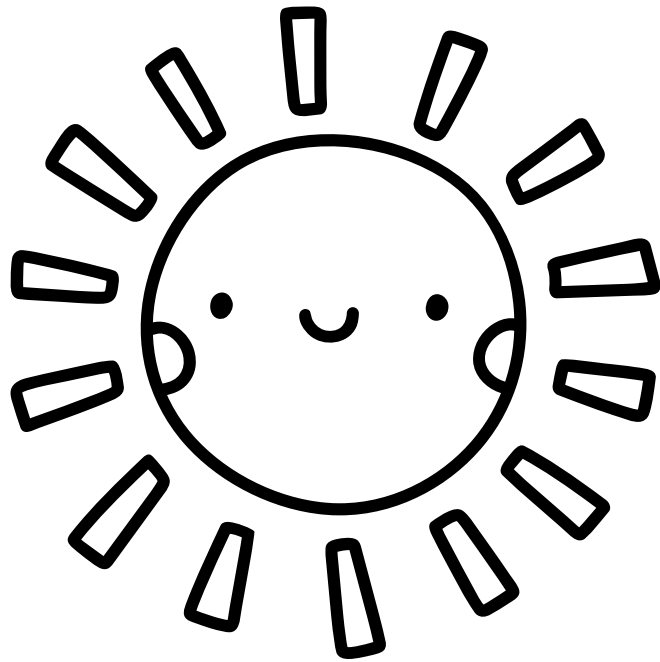
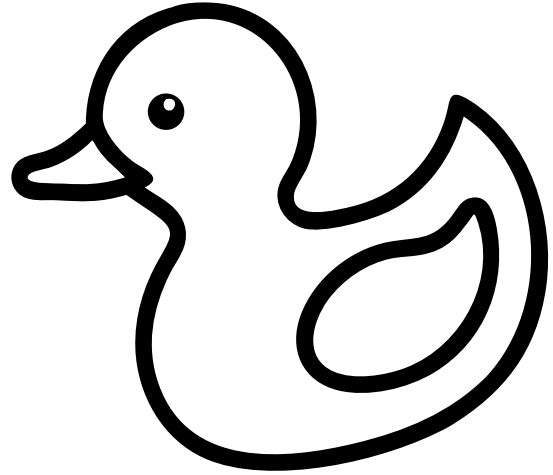
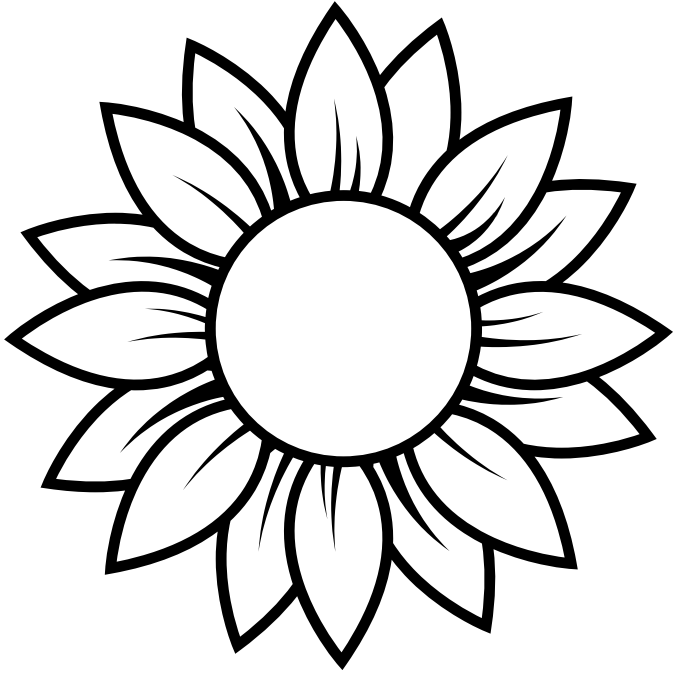
